TEXT: PSALM 19:1-14

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1. In Theology, when discussing how God has revealed Himself to man, there are two categories of revelation. What are they, and what does each one mean when we refer to it?
2. **Read Psalm 19:1-6.** In the first six verses of this passage, what category of revelation is David employing? Can you think of any other Biblical passages which also use this category of revelation?
3. **Read Psalm 19:2.** In verse two, we read “day after day they continue to speak; night after night they make Him known.” Why would David word it this way? What is David pointing to by wording it this way?
4. Verses 3 and 4 state that although creation does not speak, its testimony goes throughout all the earth. What is its testimony? Does this testimony allow a person, when they stand before God one day, to state they did not know there was a God?
5. In verses 7 through 14, David transitions to another category of revelation. What is it? Can you think of other Biblical passages which also point to this category of revelation?
6. In verses 7-8, there are four words David uses to describe the Law of the Lord. What are they? Based on these words used to describe the law of the Lord, what can we learn?
7. In verse 10, David states the Law of the Lord is more desirable than what? Why would he use these two items as an example to make his point?
8. In verse 13, David states, “Keep your servant from deliberate sins. Don’t let them control me.” In our modern-day American Christianity, what are some categories of deliberate sins it would be wise for us to be on guard against?
9. What is David’s request at the end of this passage? In private, is this the true desire of your heart as well?
