1. Greater revelation brings greater accountability.

## ASK GOD FOR WISDOM TO APPLY HIS WORD IN OUR DAILY LIVES



1. **Read Heb. 4:14-16.** What is a Believer's posture before the Father under the New Covenant? How does this differ from access to the Father in the OT? How is this new approach to the Father possible?
2. **Read Heb. 8:6-7.** Which promises in the New Covenant are particularly significant to you personally?
3. **Read Heb. 12:3.** What are some of the ways in which Christians can become "weary and discouraged"? How does the person and work of Christ encourage believers during such times?
4. Review the other 4 caution/warning passages (Heb. 2:1-4; 3:12-13; 6:4-6; 10:26-29). Are professing believers exempt from the serious self-examination required in these passages? Why or why not?
5. **Read Heb. 12:25a; Heb. 1:1-2; John 1:14,18.** Who is the one speaking to us today? How is His message being communicated? What are our responsibilities towards the communicated Word of God?
6. Review/reflect on some experiences and wonders Israel had from Egypt and the wilderness? **Read 1 Cor. 10:1-12.** Did these revelations of God's power, character, and love win the hearts of the Israelites? Why or why not?
7. **Read Heb. 3:15-19.** What brought about the judgment of God on Israel? We often find ourselves in disbelief over the fickle faith of Israel during their wilderness wanderings. How do our lives occasionally reflect similar struggles and traits?
8. **Read Heb. 2:1-3 and Heb. 10:28-29.** How should Israel's failure to hear and obey God help motivate us to not make the same mistake?
9. **Read Matt. 11:20-24.** Why will it be more tolerable for Sodom in the "day of judgment" in comparison to cities where Jesus spent large amounts of time teaching and doing miracles?
10. For those who refuse/refused to hear God's message, who will likely receive the more severe judgement: Israel, Sodom, Capernaum, or us today? On what basis? What is the relationship between revelation and accountability?
